Roseland Music Society Outreach Project...

We have now had 2 of our 4 workshops given by Emma Campbell, on Percussion, preparing for a performance of The Bohortha Dances – a Toy Symphony written in 1972. It includes triangles, Drums and tambourines but also some more unusual toy instruments – toy trumpets, a cuckoo, a quail and a Nightingale.

Kiberick class will then share what they have done in collective worship on Friday 2nd Feb.

And finally, they are all encouraged to join the children from the 3 other Roseland primary schools to play with a proper ensemble in Gerrans Memorial Hall on 10th Feb (1st Saturday of half term)

Here is the relevant extract about that event from the Roseland Magazine article:

“The following day, St Anthony’s Noyse will open up their rehearsal venue for a more informal gathering. They’ll start the day at 11, playing some of their favourites and providing singalong opportunities. Around midday, The Bohortha Dances will be given a very special performance with the toy percussion parts played by school children from all four Roseland primary schools. In the afternoon, we will clear the floor for a furry dance and provide the space for people to share memories. Who knows what will happen. Please come, join in, record your memories show us your old photos and help us to show how music has always had a special place here.

This is from the Feast bid. We have been given funding by FEAST for the project. But you should probably say that the workshops are funded by Roseland Youth Music which is the education fund for Roseland Music Society.

Jan/Feb: Primary school percussion workshops with Roseland primaries based around the Bohortha Dances (a toy symphony).

10th February: Project launch and taster day at Gerrans Memorial Hall, to include: St Anthony’s Noyse drop-in musical event; Bohortha Dances toy symphony performance with Roseland schools; dancing the traditional Furry to the Helston Flora Day tune played by St Anthony’s Noyse, recording and memory sessions, an exhibition of artefacts and photos of performing groups from living memory including Waltz on the Roseland by Mike Hitchings of Jacka Jazz.”

In RE Carne have been learning about forgiveness and have made forgiveness stones.


We have been doing lots of writing practice and becoming absolute pros at identifying regular and irregular 2, and 3D shapes.

We had a very surprising incident with ice capsules crashing into the playground, and we think it has something to do with our class story "Cakes in Space"



Learning with Kiberick...

Kiberick have had an interesting couple of weeks in lots of different ways. We really have covered a broad spectrum of topics from discussions about driver-less cars in collective worship, trying to match annual salaries to various careers in PSHE and thinking about what we might want to achieve when we are older to trying our hand at being percussion players with Emma in our Roseland music project (we look forward to sharing what we have been working on in church next Friday). In English, we were writing dialogue to accompany the short film that we are using as our writing stimulus – Broken: Rock, Paper, Scissors – and the outcomes were so impressive that we decided to write them up to be displayed. In Science, we continued our learning about forces, this time investigating gravity and magnetism as a vehicle to practice being scientists. In RE we have been looking at passages from the bible that talk about the Birth of Jesus to find evidence that Jesus was the hoped for Messiah that had been talked about in prophecies.

WAS JESUS THE MESSIAH?**

EXAMINING REPORTS FROM THE SCENE

Look for and highlight some of the evidence in the texts that led Christians to believe that Jesus was the Messiah. Link each of the expectations by highlighting or drawing a line to one or more clues in the text.

The birth of Jesus: Matthew Chapter 1

- 1 This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about. His mother Mary was engaged to marry Joseph, but before they married, she learned she was pregnant by the power of the Holy Spirit. Because Mary's husband, Joseph, was a good man, he did not want to disgrace her in public, so he planned to divorce her secretly.
- 2 While Joseph thought about these things, an angel of the Lord came to him in a dream. The angel said, "Joseph, descendant of David, don't be afraid to take Mary as your wife, because the baby in her is from the Holy Spirit." She will give birth to a son, and you will name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins.
- 3 All this happened to bring about what the Lord had said through the prophet:
 - 1 "The virgin will be pregnant. She will have a son, and they will name him Immanuel, which means 'God is with us.'"
 - 2 When Joseph woke up, he did what the Lord's angel had told him to do. Joseph took Mary as his wife.

The wise men: Matthew Chapter 2

- 1 Jesus was born in the town of Bethlehem in Judea during the time when Herod was king. When Jesus was born, some wise men from the east came to Jerusalem. They asked, "Where is the baby who is born to be the king of the Jews? We saw his star in the east and have come to worship him."
- 2 When King Herod heard this, he was troubled, as were all the people in Jerusalem. Herod called a meeting of all the leading priests and teachers of the law and asked them, "Where the Christ would be born?" They answered, "In Bethlehem in Judea. The prophet wrote about this in the Scriptures."
- 3 "But Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, was not just an insignificant village in Judah. A ruler will come from you who will be like a shepherd for my people Israel!" Micah 5:2
- 4 Then Herod had a secret meeting with the wise men and learned from them the exact time they first saw the star. He sent the wise men to Bethlehem, saying, "Look carefully for the child. When you find him, come tell me so I can worship him too."
- 5 After the wise men heard the king, they left. The star that they had seen in the east went before them until it stopped above the place where the child was. When the wise men saw the star, they were filled with joy. They came to the house where the child was and saw him with his mother, Mary, and they bowed down and worshipped him. They opened their gifts and gave him treasures of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. But God warned the wise men in a dream not to go back to Herod, so they returned to their own country by a different way.

Why is Year 6 being weighed and measured?

The school nursing team is visiting Year 6!

We are going to measure the weight and height of Year 6 pupils as part of our work to help keep the nation healthy.

What will happen?

- You will be measured one at a time in private.
- All you need to do is take your shoes off – it will be really quick!
- Only your parents or carers will see the results – not your teachers or friends.

Did you know?

- Children are weighed and measured when they are babies, and again in Reception and Year 6.
- It helps the government see how healthy the nation is, and plan health and leisure services for children.
- It's a good chance to check how you're developing and think about ways you can become healthier.

Top tips for a healthier you

Everyone can find ways to be healthier – what can you do today?


1. 5 a day

Try to eat five portions and a variety of fruit and veg every day.



2. cut back fat

Try and keep foods like crisps, buses, cakes, pastries and biscuits as occasional treats only.



3. watch the salt

Check the label and choose foods lower in salt and try not to add salt to your food.



4. sugar swaps

Swap sugary drinks for water, lower-fat milks, no-added-sugar or sugar-free drinks.



5. get going every day

Spend at least 60 minutes walking, playing sport, running around or being active every day.



6. me size meals

Children need smaller portions than grown ups. Start with a smaller amount of food on your plate, then ask for more if you are still hungry.

Free School Meals

If you think you may be eligible for Free School Meals the criteria and link you will need to follow are below. Not only would your child receive free meals but this enables the school to access additional funding. If you would apply by post please contact the office for a paper application form.

Free school meals eligibility criteria if you receive benefits

A child is eligible for free school meals if their parent/carer (or the child themselves) receives any of the following benefits:

Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods).

Income Support (IS)

Job Seekers' Allowance (Income-Based) and equal based Job Seekers Allowance

Income Related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA-IR) and equal based Employment and Support Allowance

Child Tax Credit (CTC) with an annual income of less than £16,190

Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Guarantee Element of Pension Credit (GPC)

Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 (IAA) Supports

If you are claiming the benefits listed below you are not eligible for free school meals. This is regardless of what other benefits/credits are being claimed.

Working Tax Credit

Contribution-Based Job Seeker's Allowance and/or Contribution-Based Employment and Support Allowance


